

Rules for Local Recycling Stations in Odense Municipality

- Hazardous waste such as surplus medicines, hospital waste, oil and chemical waste is not accepted. It can be handed in at your local recycling station every 7th weekend. See which weekends on your collection calendar.
- Ordinary household waste and hospital waste is not accepted.
- Waste materials other than those stated on the containers are not accepted.
- Vans, lorries etc. with a total weight exceeding 3500 kg are not allowed at the station, but are referred to the combined Industrial and Local Recycling Station, Havnegade 102, or Odense Environmental Center, Strandlækkevej 100.
- Parking for unloading must take place in the left side of the road. Turn off the engine.
- Parking for purposes other than unloading on the site is not permitted. It is prohibited to enter at the station outside opening hours.
- It is prohibited to remove objects from the station.
- Disposal of litter outside opening hours is prohibited.
- The local recycling stations are for residents of Odense Municipality only. They are obliged to follow the instructions of the staff.
- Businesses do not have access to the stations. Please refer to the Industrial and Local Recycling Station, Havnegade 102, or contact our commercial waste consultants, on phone: 63 13 82 00. They will be pleased to provide advice to businesses.
- Violation of the rules will be dealt with according to the municipal Waste Disposal Regulations in force.

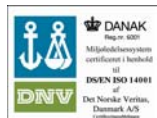

It is important that you sort your waste correctly

The idea of the Danish waste management system is to recycle as much waste as possible. By recycling, the resources are optimally exploited and the environment is protected.

In order to reuse waste from private households, the waste must be sorted. Therefore you have to sort it out by type and hand in the recyclable part of your waste at the local recycling station.

Local Recycling Stations

There are 8 local recycling stations in Odense.

On the plant overview, you can see which types of waste you can hand in here, and where the different containers are placed.

Sorting at your Local Recycling Station - Please do not dispose of your waste in bags and sacks.

2 Newspapers, circulars, magazines

Many types of paper are recyclable - newspapers, copy paper, circulars, magazines, catalogues, envelopes and leaflets.

Important: Put gift wrappings and wallpaper in container 20.

3 Books and telephone books

Books are glued together and the glue must be cut away before recycling.

4 Cardboard and paper bags

Cardboard boxes, corrugated cardboard, paper bags and card.

7 Plate glass

Please sort your flat glass into glass without frames and glass with frames.

8 Bottles and jars

This container is for ordinary glass bottles and clean pickle and jam jars.

Please remove tops, corks and lids before disposal.

Important: Put china, crockery and pottery in container 24.

9 Electronic waste

Televisions, monitors, computers, stereos, copy and fax machines and other electronic and electric equipment.

10 Metals

Metals, steel furniture, garden tools, domestic goods such as ovens and washing machines plus clean aluminium packaging.

11 Refrigerators and freezers

Refrigerators and freezers must be emptied before disposal.

12 Soft plastic

Foils, bags and packaging made from soft plastic.

13 Hard plastic

PVC plastic, plastic furniture, jars, bottles, drain pipes, buckets, gutters etc.

14 Asbestos and eternit

Small amounts of roof materials containing asbestos and eternit. Including asbestuous

insulation materials.

16 Garden waste

Leaves, grass, branches from the garden. Garden waste is taken to Odense Environmental Center, where it is transformed into compost.

Please cut trunks and big branches into small pieces before disposal.

17 Carpets

Important: No linoleum. Please put linoleum in container 18 or 20.

18 Incinerable items over 1 metre in length

Wooden furniture, building materials, mattresses, wood etc.

This container is for incinerable waste that cannot be recycled. It will be taken to the incineration plant, shredded up and burned.

Important: Garden waste, gypsum boards, roofing felt and PVC are not to be disposed of in this container.

19 Tyres

With or without rims.

20 Incinerable items less than 1 metre in length

Small wooden items, polystyrene/flamingo. Gift wrapping and wall paper.

Important: Garden waste, gypsum boards, roofing felt and PVC are not to be disposed of in this container.

22 Soil, sand and gravel

With or without stones.

24 Plaster and rockwool

Plaster and insulating materials/rockwool etc.

25 Pressure-treated wood

Pressure-treated wood might contain hazardous chemicals. It must be treated correctly before incineration.

26 Concrete, rubble and tiles

Building materials such as concrete, rubble, clay, tiles etc.
Crushed and recycled.

Important: Asbestos and eternit in container 14.

27 Reusable items

(Only at 5 of the recycling stations)

- Furniture
- Household goods (kitchen appliances etc.)
- Bicycles, garden tools, lawn mowers etc.
- Books, magazines, toys

These containers are locked. Please contact the station personnel.

Important: It is not permitted to hand in electronic and electrical devices, refrigerators, and freezers here.

28 Textiles

Humanitarian organisations will ensure that reusable items of clothing will be used for a good purpose.

30 Car batteries

Car batteries and small batteries.

32 Strip light (fluorescent tubes) and energy-saving bulbs

Light bulbs containing mercury.

Hazardous waste

Oil and chemicals might cause accidents in households and can be a source of pollution of the environment. Therefore you must hand in your hazardous waste in one of the following ways:

- **Hazardous waste centre** at our headquarters at Snapindvej and at the Industrial and Local Recycling Station, Havnegade 102, during usual opening hours.
- **The Hazardous Waste Collection Truck** takes hazardous waste every 7th weekend at your local recycling station - see the dates on your collection calendar.
- **Call service** - call us, and we collect your hazardous waste from your red box. For further information please call: 63 13 82 00.
